#### **Street Parking: Restricted Parking Zone (RPZ) Program**

The Restricted Parking Zone (RPZ) Program helps make public, on-street parking easier in some residential areas. These areas have a parking demand generator like a college, hospital, school, or business district.

#### **Fremont is located in Zone 27**

Residents wishing to park their car on city streets should purchase a RPZ permit.

#### **Moving and Storage Container Permits**

Within Seattle, portable containers for moving and storage placed in the public right-of-way require a Street Use permit before they're delivered and placed.

You do not need a permit for moving trucks. If your moving truck will be in a restricted parking area, you may need to establish a Temporary No Parking Zone. If you have a trailer and hitch parked in the right-of-way, it must be attached to a vehicle.


## Biking

Seattle has an extensive system of walking and biking trails that allow for car free routes to many parts of Seattle.

The **Burke-Gilman Trail** is 2 blocks away and runs along the south end of Fremont, along the canal. It also links up to other trails, including those to South Lake Union and the East Side.
