Street Parking: Restricted Parking Zone (RPZ) Program

The Restricted Parking Zone (RPZ) Program helps make public, on-street parking easier in some residential areas. These areas have a parking demand generator like a college, hospital, school, or business district.

Parkrose Apartments is located in Zone 15

Residents wishing to park their car on city streets should purchase a RPZ permit.

Moving and Storage Container Permits

Within Seattle, portable containers for moving and storage placed in the public right-of-way require a Street Use permit before they're delivered and placed.

You do not need a permit for moving trucks. If your moving truck will be in a restricted parking area, you may need to establish a Temporary No Parking Zone. If you have a trailer and hitch parked in the right-of-way, it must be attached to a vehicle.

Temporary Parking in Front of Parkrose Apartments

Temporary parking in front of the Parkrose Apartments may be permitted during your move under the following conditions:

- **Active loading/unloading only**
- Vehicle must be moved to city street parking as soon as possible
- Do not block the sidewalk or roadway
- Driver must stay onsite and be available
- Vehicle must be ***moved immediately upon request***
- Contact information for driver must be posted in lobby (including Apt and phone #)
- If possible, contact landlord ahead of time so that garage residents can be notified

Vehicles not following the above conditions or where the driver cannot be found may be towed at the owner's expense.
